The 'Osborne Brothers' are listed under the business name index and were the sons of an important family in Scottsville, Virginia. Their parents, Mrs. Annie Grey 'Nannie' Eppes and Dr. William Egbert Osborne, were originally from Buckingham County, Virginia, where the Eppes owned a plantation by the name of Millbrook Plantation. William was a medical doctor and had nine children with his wife 'Nannie': Patty, Thomas, Wylie, Tempe, Nellie, Nita, Ann, Carrie, and William ('Willie', shown at left). The Osborne brothers, Wylie, Willie, and Thomas, ran stores that they owned.
